





Sailing Instructions Open Dutch Championship Olympia-Jol class organized by ZV Belterwiede under the auspices of the RNWA September 30th & October 1st 2023 location: Beulaker Wiede, Wanneperveen

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- **1.2** The following rules of RRS are changed: A5.1, A5.2 and A10
- 1.3 RRS Appendix P applies
- **1.4** [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official. Failure to comply may be misconduct.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09:00 hrs on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 hrs on the day before it will take effect.

3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- **3.1** Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located nearby the race office.

4 [DP] CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.
- **4.2** Competitors and support persons shall handle any equipment by the organizing authority with care, seamanship, in accordance with any instructions for its use and without interfering with its functionality.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagpole near the race office.
- **5.2** When flag AP **• •** is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.







6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

6.1 Dates and number of races

Date	Class	Number of races	Warningsignal first race of the day

1 st October	Olympia Jol	3	09:25

- 6.2 One extra race per day may be sailed, provided that no class becomes more than one race ahead of schedule and the change is made according to SI 2.1.
- 6.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is see schedule SI 6.1
- **6.4** To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.
- 6.5 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15:00 hrs.
- 7.1 The Class flags are: Olympia-jol Classsign

8 RACING AREA

8.1 SI Addendum B shows the location of the racing area.

9 COURSES

9.1 The diagram(s) in SI Addendum A show(s) the course, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

10 MARKS

- **10.1** Marks 1S, 1P, 2S and 2P will be yellow cylindrical buoy.
- **10.2** The starting marks will be a buoy with staff displaying an orange flag and an orange flag on the starting vessel.
- **10.3** The finishing marks: will be a buoy with staff displaying a blue flag and a blue flag on the finishing vessel.

11 OBSTRUCTIONS

12 THE START

- **12.1** Races will be started using RRS 26.
- **12.2** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and a staff displaying an orange flag on a buoy at the port end.







12.3 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

13.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark or the finishing line to a new position. No flags or signals will be displayed or given. This changes RRS rule 33.

This change of rule 33 will only apply by changes with a maximum of 10'. In case of changes greater than 10', rule 33 will apply.

14 THE FINISH

14.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the finishing mark at the port-end and a blue flag on the finishing vessel at the starboard-end.

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

15.1 Appendix P applies

16 TIME LIMITS [AND TARGET TIMES]

16.1 The Mark 1 Time Limit, Race Target Time (see RRS 35), and the Finishing Window are shown in the table below.

Mark 1 Time Limit	Race Target Time	Finishing Window
20 min	40 min	20 min

- **16.2** If no boat has passed Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit the race will be abandoned.
- **16.3** The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalized or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window. This changes RRS A5.1, A5.2 and A10.
- **16.4** Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

17 HEARING REQUESTS

- **17.1** The protest time limit is 45 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The time will be posted on the official notice board located near the race office.
- **17.2** Hearing request forms are available from the race office.
- **17.3** Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located near the race office.

19 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- **19.1** Substitution of competitors will not be allowed.
- **19.2** Substitution of marked damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless approved by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity, which may be after the race.

20 EQUIPMENT CHECKS AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- **20.1** A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.
- **20.2** [DP] When instructed by a race official on the water, a boat shall proceed to a designated area for inspection.

21 SUPPLIED BOATS

22 OFFICIAL VESSELS

22.1 Official vessels will be marked as follows: white flag with "R"

23 [DP] SUPPORT TEAMS

23.1 Team leaders, coaches and other support persons shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first start until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

24 TRASH DISPOSAL

24.1 Trash may be placed aboard official or support persons boats.


